**OPSB (Schools in LEA) vs. OPSB District Explained**  
 OPSB (Schools in LEA) describes schools for which OPSB is the Local Educational Agency. For these schools, Louisiana Department of Education uses a common accountability measure to assess performance. OPSB schools not included here are their own Local Educational Agency and Louisiana Department of Education does not provide to OPSB data regarding Free and Reduced Lunch, Gifted and Talented, and Students with Disabilities enrollment.

**\* Free and Reduced Lunch vs. Economically Disadvantaged**  
 The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) allows schools with high poverty rates to offer both breakfast and lunch at no charge to all students while eliminating the traditional school meal application process. Schools are able to opt into the Community Eligibility, but upon entry into the program the school no longer collects meal applications. The maximum income to be reported as Free or Reduced is significantly different between CEP and non CEP schools.

Within the Annual Report we utilized economically disadvantaged percentages for all schools to consistently portray each school community's economic situation. An alternative measure is the Free/Reduced Lunch percentage which is less consistent across schools because the underlying data utilizes different income requirements.

**\*\* % Economically Disadvantaged Explained**  
 The state determines this number by the unduplicated count of students who are eligible for Medicaid, SNAP, LEP, TANF; or are homeless, migrant, incarcerated youth, awaiting foster care.

**\*\* Free/Reduced Lunch Data Explained**  
 For CEP schools: students are marked as free if 1)they are on the Direct Certification list (generated by the state) or 2) they fall into a DC category (homeless, etc).  
 For non-CEP schools: meal applications are used and students are marked free/reduced.  
 For non-CEP schools, the FRL count is the "poverty" indicator used for federal grants purposes

**\*\*\* Students with disabilities / Gifted and Talented**  
 Data for Students with Disabilities and Gifted and Talented students is valid as of Feb 1, 2016 as exceptionality data is captured by schools through the Fall.
